TAX COLLECTOR:

PET OWNERS: When walking your pets, please be responsible and clean up after them. Thank you!



RENTAL UNITS: All residential rental units must be registered and inspected by the Borough. If you have a rental, or plan to rent your property, please call the Borough office for details.

VEHICLES: All vehicles parked outside of an enclosed structure (garage) shall be current with both inspection & registration, shall not have flat tires or be dismantled and must be operable.

POOLS: All Pools (temporary or permanent) capable of holding 24 inches of water or more_must

meet the building code regulations of Dallastown Borough. Please fill out the building permit application prior to setting up your pool.

TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALKS:

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way.

GRASS GROWING IN THE CURBS & SIDEWALKS:



Help Dallastown Borough keep its smalltown charm by removing the weeds from your sidewalks. The sidewalks adjacent to your property are yours to maintain. Grass


& weeds are to be removed from curbing & sidewalks. This includes where the curb joins the street and around utility poles & traffic signs.

Kindly <u>refrain</u> from discharging grass clippings into the streets or on the sidewalks.

GRASS GROWING IN EXCESS OF 8 INCHES ON YOUR PROPERTY:

Grass & other vegetation shall be maintained to a height of no more than 8 inches on your property. Poison ivy and other nuisance "weeds" shall be removed as well.

Penn Waste would like to issue a reminder to residents in south central Pennsylvania that pool chemicals should NOT be disposed of in your curbside trash and recycling bins. Pool chemicals are considered hazardous waste and need to be disposed of properly.

The Solution

Here are several options for getting rid of pool chemicals:


- Take them to a facility that handles hazardous waste. Make sure you check with your local solid waste authority to see if they accept pool chemicals prior to arriving.
- York County Solid Waste Authority
- Check with the pool store you originally bought them from to see if they have a disposal method.
- Donate them to a community pool or your neighbors who have pools.
- Shock your pool by dumping the left over pool chemicals in before you close it for the season.

What is Stormwater Runoff, and Why is it Important?

Stormwater runoff is rain or snowmelt that flows over the ground and into the Borough's stormwater system or directly into creeks and streams.

As this runoff flows, it can pick up and transport harmful pollutants such as oils and greases, heavy metals, pesticides, fertilizers, trash and debris, sediment, and animal wastes.




Our storm drains do not connect to water treatment facilities, but rather drain untreated into local waterways.

Pollutants are carried along with stormwater runoff into our creeks, streams, and the Chesapeake Bay.

As a result, contaminated stormwater runoff is a major source of pollution to our local waterways. Excessive contamination of runoff causes sedimentation of our streams, water quality degradation, and unhealthy water conditions for humans and wildlife.


DALLASTOWN BOROUGH'S STORMWATER SYSTEM & STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM:

Dallastown Borough has a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4). This means that stormwater and sanitary sewage are completely separated.



The Borough's stormwater conveyance system is made up of storm drains, curbs, gutters, ditches, man-made channels, and streams that are connected by a network of underground pipes.

Since our stormwater system drains to surface waters, Dallastown Borough is required to develop a stormwater management program. There are six key elements of the stormwater management program; the key elements are addressed through the development and implementation of best management practices (BMPs) and will lead to water quality improvements through the reduction of pollutants to the maximum extent practicable.



11 WAYS TO CONSERVE WATER AT HOME

- 1. Run a full dishwasher instead of handwashing: If you ditch handwashing and run full loads of dishes instead, you can save 7,000 gallons of water annually.
- **2.** Compost to reduce disposal use: Save water in both your kitchen and your lawn by composting kitchen scraps at home.
- **3. Steam rather than boil vegetables:** Steaming your vegetables <u>saves water</u> and makes your vegetables more nutrient-rich.
- **4. Soak rather than rinse your pots and pans:** For items too big or dirty to make it into the dishwasher, skip the rinse and soak them to remove food buildup and stains.
- **5. Take quick showers rather than baths:** Bad news for tub enthusiasts: a full bath uses up to <u>70 gallons of water</u>. On the other hand, short showers can cut up to 45 gallons of that waste.
- **6. Turn off the faucet as you brush:** While brushing your teeth twice a day is important turning the faucet off during your teeth cleaning can save 10 gallons of water per day.
- 7. Install a high-efficiency toilet: Older toilets use anywhere from 3.5 to 7 gallons of water per flush. If you're flushing 10 times a day, that's up to 70 gallons of water per day from your toilet alone. Installing a high-efficiency toilet cuts this water use down to 1.28 gallons or less per flush.
- 8. Check pipes and appliances for leaks regularly: Don't waste 105 gallons of water on leaky bathroom appliances. These appliances or pipes leaks are a major waste of water, and the worst part is that you're not aware you're using it.
- 9. Use cold water for your washes: Ninety percent of energy during the laundry process is used heating the water. Opting for cold water whenever possible, will save on energy costs. Turning down your hot water tank is another good way to conserve energy: Try setting it to 120 degrees or lower.
- **10. Run full loads:** Resist the urge to run a laundry load when you have a few dirty items. Running full loads instead of half loads can save 3,400 gallons of water annually.

Upgrade your appliances: A household saves \$380 per year by upgrading to Energy Star and/or Water.



Our care is Driven and Centered around our Community.

York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc. (formerly Yoe Ambulance Service) has now merged with West York Ambulance and Grantley EMS to form *First Capital EMS*. We will continue to serve Dallastown Borough, Yoe Borough, and York Township from the fire companies in Yoe and Spry.

First Capital EMS. is a non-profit, 501(c)3, charitable organization incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We are licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Health and are dispatched by the York County Department of Emergency Services - 911 Center.

The 2023 Annual Subscription requests will be mailed in late May and early June. Our new subscription year will run July 1 through June 30. All current subscriptions will be honored until June 30, 2023. The Subscription is available to the residents and businesses of Yoe and Dallastown Boroughs, and those portions of York Township and Windsor Township serviced by York Regional EMS. Why Should I Buy an Ambulance Subscription? Peace of Mind in an Emergency:

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital or will pay for only those fees they consider to be "usual and customary." Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour a day emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion, of the fees not covered by private insurance, becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a *First Capital EMS Subscriber*, payment from your insurance carrier(s) will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to First Capital EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service.

This subscription is also honored by 5 neighboring EMS agencies shown below:

Jacobus Ambulance Red Lion Ambulance Southern York County EMS Eureka Fire and Ambulance Rose Fire Company (New Freedom)

*All patients will be responsible for a charge of \$95 - \$300 for refusal of transport, when evaluation and/or treatment is provided. Non-transport is not covered by the subscription.



STOP HOPPER: HOP ABOARD!

When communities have increased mobility options, residents have increased possibilities to improve their quality of life. rabbittransit's Stop Hopper microtransit service, available in Red Lion, Dallastown, and East York, offers area residents the opportunity of greater mobility.

The Stop Hopper is a compact, neighborhood friendly-sized public transit vehicle. Unlike fixed route or shared ride, the Stop Hopper is designed for smaller, rural communities, allowing patrons to access to the benefits of public transportation through a direct ride model.

For just \$2 per ride, riders can travel anywhere within the Red Lion/Dallastown/East York service zone by requesting a ride using the Stop Hopper smartphone app. Following a ride request, the app provides an estimated pick-up time, tracks vehicles in real-time and alerts passengers when their ride is about to arrive. Passengers are picked up in a nine-person, ADA accessible van and taken where they want to go.

The Stop Hopper app is available for download via the $\underline{\text{App}}$ $\underline{\text{Store}}$ or $\underline{\text{Google Play}}$.

Operating hours range from 6:30am to 6:30pm, Monday through Friday. The service is free for seniors 65+ who possess a registered free fare ID card. Riders may also place a ride request by calling 1-800-632-9063, one hour before their desired pick- up time.







- The IRS will never ask for a credit or debit card number over the phone.
- The IRS will never threaten to send local police or other law enforcement to have a taxpayer arrested.
