FLUSHING: The Dallastown-Yoe Water Authority will begin flushing hydrants on May 6th. Please be aware that some discoloration

of the water may occur, and you may be without water for short periods of time during the flushing procedure. Make sure your water is not discolored before doing

STREETLIGHTS:



If you happen to see a streetlight that is out or not functioning properly, please contact the Borough Office. We are not always around at night to see the problems first-hand, so any

help would be greatly appreciated. We will contact Met Ed to have them fixed.

TAX COLLECTOR:

Linda Shaub, the Dallastown Borough Tax Collector will be at the Borough Office on Friday, April 12th from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm and Monday,



April 15th from noon to 2:00 pm. She will be located in the Council Room to the rear of the building. Please enter thru the double glass doors on the side of the building.

PET OWNERS: When walking your pets, please be responsible and clean up after them. Also remember your pets must be leashed, and under your control at all times when not on your property. Thank you!

RENTAL UNITS: All residential rental units must be registered and inspected by the Borough. If you have a rental, or plan to rent your property, please call the Borough office for details.

VEHICLES: All vehicles parked outside of an enclosed structure (garage) shall be current with both inspection & registration, shall not have flat tires or be dismantled and must be operable.

POOLS: All Pools (temporary or permanent) capable of holding 24 inches of water or more must



meet the building code regulations of

Dallastown Borough. Please fill out the building permit application prior to setting up your pool.

TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALKS:

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way.

GRASS GROWING IN THE CURBS & SIDEWALKS:



Help Dallastown Borough keep its smalltown charm by removing the weeds from your sidewalks. The sidewalks adjacent to your property are yours to maintain. Grass

& weeds are to be removed from curbing & sidewalks. This includes where the curb joins the street and around utility poles & traffic signs.

Kindly <u>refrain</u> from discharging grass clippings into the streets or on the sidewalks.

GRASS GROWING IN EXCESS OF 8 INCHES ON YOUR PROPERTY:

Grass & other vegetation shall be maintained to a height of no more than 8 inches on your property. Poison ivy and other nuisance "weeds" shall be removed as well.



If your property falls into a non-compliance state, a violation letter will be sent by certified mail to the owner or tenants who reside on the property. If the nuisances still exist, a non-traffic citation will be issued each day the property is in non-compliance.

YARD SALE PERMIT: A permit is required per



Dallastown Borough Ordinance. You may stop into the Borough office at 175 E. Broad St. to purchase a permit, the cost is \$10.00.

Penn Waste would like to issue a reminder to residents in south central Pennsylvania that pool chemicals should NOT be disposed of in your curbside trash and recycling bins. Pool chemicals are considered hazardous waste and need to be disposed of properly.

The Solution

Here are several options for getting rid of pool chemicals:

- Take them to a facility that handles hazardous waste. Make sure you check with your local solid waste authority to see if they accept pool chemicals prior to arriving.
- York County Solid Waste Authority
- Check with the pool store you originally bought them from to see if they have a disposal method.
- Donate them to a community pool or your neighbors who have pools.
- Shock your pool by dumping the left over pool chemicals in before you close it for the season.



What happens when it rains?

f you've been thinking about reducing your environmental footprint, you can take steps to decrease the amount of pollution that flows into local waterways every time it rains. Known as stormwater, once rain or snow hits the ground, it can pick up dirt, chemicals, and other pollutants and carry them downstream from your sidewalks, streets, and alleys to bodies of water in your community.

Rain is great for growing things in the city, but excess rain can run off from roofs, pavement, and other hard surfaces into the street, where it flows from the storm drain into local rivers, lakes, or streams, taking pollution from those surfaces with it. Here are just a few steps you can take to be stormwater smart, starting in your own neighborhood:





- If you park your car on the street, check for spots underneath it, which could be a sign of leaky oil or other fluids that can contaminate stormwater as it washes by. Don't let your leak pollute.
- Street sweeping is an important part of stormwater management; during posted sweeping hours, don't park your car on the street.
- Keep garbage cans covered to keep trash from blowing and avoid rainwater getting contaminated by your trash. Never dump garbage in alleys or gutters.
- Read the label to dispose of household chemicals and paints properly, and never dump them in the alley, on the sidewalk, or in the street.
- Keep raked leaves or yard clippings out of the storm drain to avoid clogs and debris that can reach waterways.
- Don't hose down sidewalks; that will flush dirt down through the storm drain system!
- During colder weather, avoid oversalting the sidewalk or use "green" deicer—a little goes a long way!
- Always pick up after your dog by putting waste in a bag and disposing it in an appropriate waste container, rather than dropping it in the storm drain.
- Never drop cigarette butts on the ground; put out cigarettes and drop the butts in a proper receptacle or trash can.
- Always put trash in its place and keep it away from storm drains.

DID YOU KNOW?

Everything you put on the ground can possibly contaminate local water bodies and affect public health.

Building Bridges for Brianna had an amazing 2023 and is already off to an amazing 2024! We have continued to break the silence of mental health with our efforts. We want people struggling with mental health to know its ok to not be ok, we just can't stay that way. How do we do that? By opening and asking for help and accepting the help. We have increased our resources to help pay for co-pays for therapy, counseling, and medication, as well as continuing to provide coping mechanisms and training for QPR (Question Persuade and Respond). At the end of 2023, we opened an office here in Dallastown to provide free and reduced therapy to community members that need therapy and counseling while they are on a waiting list for permanent treatment. We are also holding our 4th annual Bridge Building Festival on June 22, 2024, at Dallastown Community Park, from 12pm-10pm, with live music, 100+ vendors, food trucks, raffles, pull tabs, kid's games and much more.







Savvy Citizen is a new way for the borough to contact all our residents and water subscribers at any given time in case of an emergency such as water main breaks in your





Our call volume has increased each year from our first year of service in 2021. Increased demands are put on our personnel to provide more of their time to our department, and we have met that challenge. Our call amount for 2023 was 1,011 calls of service. We averaged eight people per call.

EASTER EGG HUNT



Why Should I Buy an Ambulance Subscription? Peace of Mind in an Emergency:

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a *First Capital EMS Subscriber*, payment from your insurance carrier(s) will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to First Capital EMS immediately upon receipt.

If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. This subscription is also honored by 5 neighboring EMS agencies shown below:

*All patients will be responsible for a charge of \$95 - \$300 for refusal of transport, when evaluation and/or treatment is provided. Non-transport is not covered by the subscription.

As we approach the Spring season, this means that severe weather can arrive at a moment's notice. No matter where you live! Wind, rain, hail, tornadoes, and other elements can cause extensive damage to your home and property. It's always a good idea to be prepared for what Mother Nature throws your way. Below is a Spring storm checklist to proactively protect your home and property from damaging spring storms.

- 1.Familiarize yourself with your insurance coverage- Every homeowner should know exactly what their policy covers or doesn't cover.
- 2.Assess-Take a walk around your property often to see if there is any damage by either old man winter or from summer mayhem make necessary repairs
- 3.Ensure sump pumps are working Spring runoff and torrential rainfall can all result in flooded basements
- 4. Secure backyard items High winds can turn unsecured items into missiles.
- 5. Trim and Prune trees -Remove dead branches that could end up being dangerous projectiles in a severe storm
- 6. Think Ahead make ice, lots of it. Fill up empty soda bottles with water and freeze them, it will come in handy in both a cooler and refrigerator, like an old-time icebox.
- 7. Use a cooler for essential foods this way you can leave the refrigerator closed and keep the foods that you absolutely need to access cool and safe.
- 8. Think Camping either get a camp stove or use the grill to cook if you lost power
- 9. Keep your cell phone charged before the power goes out

Other Safety tips to consider- Be sure you're receiving weather alerts on your cell phone. Know your community's warning system for everyone in the family, review your borough evacuation route and identify where shelters are located.

STOP HOPPER: HOP ABOARD!

When communities have increased mobility options, residents have increased possibilities to improve their quality of life. rabbittransit's **Stop Hopper** microtransit service, available in Red Lion, Dallastown, and East York, offers area residents the opportunity of greater mobility.

The Stop Hopper is a compact, neighborhood friendly-sized public transit vehicle. Unlike fixed route or shared ride, the Stop Hopper is designed for smaller, rural communities, allowing patrons to access the benefits of public transportation through a direct ride model.

Riders can travel anywhere within the Red Lion/Dallastown/East York service zone by requesting a ride using the Stop Hopper smartphone app. Following a ride request, the app provides an estimated pick-up time, tracks vehicles in real-time and alerts passengers when their ride is about to arrive. Passengers are picked up in a nine-person, ADA accessible van and taken where they want to go.

The Stop Hopper app is available for download via the **App Store** or **Google Play.**

Operating hours range from 6:30am to 6:30pm, Monday through Friday. The service is free for seniors 65+ who possess a registered free fare ID card. Riders may also place a ride request by calling 1-800-632-9063, one hour before their desired pick- up time.
