Tree limbs, sticks, shrub or hedge trimmings, grass, stones or any other foreign objects are not to be deposited in the leaves; otherwise the leaves will not be collected. FIREWORKS!!!

Feel the need to celebrate? The State of Pennsylvania has repealed and replaced the Fireworks Act of 1939 in its entirety. House Bill 542 was signed into law on October 30, 2017.

Here are some of the highlights of the new Bill:

- Consumers can now purchase and use "Class C" or "consumer-grade" fireworks that include firecrackers, Roman Candles, bottle rockets, and similar fireworks that contain a maximum of 50 milligrams of explosive material. The expansion includes those fireworks that were previously only available to out-of-state residents.
- Display fireworks, containing more than 130 milligrams of explosive materials, and aerial shells, containing more than 60 grams of pyrotechnic compositions, are only to be used by professionals with a permit from the municipality.
- Must be at least 18 years of age to purchase fireworks.
- **RESTRICTIONS:** Cannot be discharged on public or private property with express permission of the property owner. Cannot be discharged from, within, or toward a motor vehicle or building. Cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure. Cannot be discharged while the person in under the influence of alcohol, controlled substance or another drug.
- They can be purchase at any licensed facility, including temporary ones which are tents or other structures found in parking lots.



<u>SIDEWALKS</u> – Snow/ice is to be removed from the sidewalks within 24 hours after a winter storm ceases. Properties at street intersections: **please** clear the snow that piles up at the sidewalk corners. This will help school children, the postal service and other pedestrians safely cross the street. We ask those who do not have sidewalks to follow this as well.

PLOWING STREETS – The snow plows will be plowing snow from "curb to curb" to remove as much snow from the streets as possible. This process takes time so please have patience and bear with us as we work to clear the streets as quickly as we can. When removing snow from your sidewalks, do not shovel the snow into the streets.

**In heavy snow storms, plows will be clearing driving lanes as quickly as possible and then will go back to work on clearing the sides/shoulders of the roads from curb to curb. Unfortunately, this sometimes pushes snow back on to your sidewalks which you may already have shoveled. If this occurs, we apologize for the inconvenience and added work that it may cause you, but it is essential to make our streets safe.

In the event of a **Snow Emergency**, announcements will be made on **WGAL-TV 8**, **FOX 43**, **ABC 27 WHTM**, **CBS 21**, **WARM 103.3**, **96.1 WSOX**, **FROGGY 107.7**, **ROCKY 98.5** and the local newspapers.

<u>NO PARKING</u> will be allowed on the "snow emergency routes" when an emergency is declared. Vehicles that are not moved will be towed at the vehicle owner's expense.

Snow Emergency Routes:

The following streets shall be declared snow emergency routes: (Streets are posted)

- Main St.
- South side of W. Maple St. from Borough Line to N. Walnut St.
- South side of E. Maple St. from N. Walnut St. to N. Park St.
- N. Walnut St. from Main St. to Maple St.
- S. Walnut (WEST SIDE ONLY) from Main St. to E. Gay St.
- E. Gay St. (SOUTH SIDE ONLY) from S. Walnut St. to S. Pleasant Ave.
- N. Pleasant Ave. from Main St. to E. Broad St.
- E. Broad St. from N. Pleasant Ave. to N. Lombard St.
- N. Lombard St. from E. Broad St. to Borough Line
- S. Pleasant Ave. from Main St. to Borough Line
- N. Park St. from Main St. to E. Maple St.



Temporary parking is available at the following locations when a snow emergency is in effect: Fire Company parking lot, High School and Elementary School parking lots and Bethlehem United Methodist Church, Christ Lutheran Church and St. Paul's United Church of Christ parking lots.





CHINESE RESTRICTIONS ON IMPORTS CREATING RECYCLING INDUSTRY CRISIS

There have been some changes which severely impacted the recycling industry. The United States generates more recycling material than any other country in the world and China is the world's largest buyer of recycling material. The Chinese government recently imposed new rules severely restricting the levels of contamination allowed in the recyclable material they accept. These changes have had a catastrophic consequences on the US recycling industry.

Contamination is any non-recyclable item (aka trash) that gets mixed into a bale of recyclable material. When bales of recyclables arrive in China, they are cut open and sorted through. Items such as plastic bags, clothing, medical waste, Christmas lights and any other nonrecyclable items are considered "contamination".

Previously, bales were allowed to have around 5% contamination in them, or 92 lbs of trash, in a 1,850 lb bale of recyclable paper. Beginning in 2018, China changed those restrictions to a 0.5% contamination rate, or 9 lbs of trash in a 1,850 lb bale of recycled paper. This is an unrealistic number that recycling companies cannot meet.

Many of our customers are enthusiastic recyclers and want to make sure they're doing it properly. Recycling continues to be the future of the waste industry by itn will come at a cost if there is no market for recycling material. We need our customers' help in making sure they're not throwing trash in with their recycling so that we can try to meet China's new contamination limits.

We encourage all of our customers to do the following:

Every year more than 300,000 people experience Cardiac Arrest. Sudden cardiac arrest is due to an electrical rhythm problem making the heart incapable of pumping blood to the rest of the body.

The signs and symptoms can include:

Sudden loss of responsiveness.

There is no response to any question or touch. No normal breathing

Not breathing at all or only gasping

What you should do:

Tap and shout.

Tap the person and ask, "Are you okay?" if he does not move, speak, blink or otherwise react then he is not responding.

Yell for help.

Tell someone to call 911 and get an AED (if one is available) If you are alone dial 911 and get the AED.

Check Breathing.

If the person isn't breathing or is only gasping, begin CPR.

Give CPR.

Push hard and fast so the chest goes down at least 2 inches at a rate of 100 to 120 pushes per minute. Allow the chest to return to normal position before administering the next push.

Use an AED

If available, turn on and follow the prompts.

Continue CPR.

Keeping pushing until the person starts to breath or move or until someone with more advanced skill arrives.

Early CPR can double or even triple the chance of survival. About 85% of cardiac arrests take place at home. If you don't know CPR, learn it and be confident that if ever needed you too could save a life.

Dallastown Lions Club Awards Scholarship


