


BOROUGH NEWS and Reminders

FLUSHING: The Dallastown-Yoe Water Authority will begin flushing hydrants on April 27th. Please be aware that some discoloration of the water may occur, and you may be without

water for short periods of time during the flushing procedure. Make sure your water is not discolored before doing laundry.

POTHOLES:

With the harsh winter that we've had, it's almost a guarantee that there will be potholes throughout the Borough. If you happen to discover any that Borough Maintenance has not, please contact the Borough Office at 244-6626. Thanks so much for your help!



Wednesday, April 22th depending on the weather. Please have your sidewalks cleaned before street sweeping begins. Thank you!

TAX COLLECTION: Linda Shaub, the Tax Collector, will be in the Community Room of the Dallastown Borough Building on Tuesday, April 14th from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm and Wednesday, April 15th from noon to 4:00 pm to receive tax payments.

PET OWNERS: When walking your pets, please be responsible and clean up after them. Thank you!



STREET LIGHTS: If you happen to see a street light that is out or not functioning properly, please contact the Borough Office. We are not always around at night to see the problems first-hand, so any help would be greatly appreciated.

RENTAL UNITS: All residential rental units must be registered and inspected by the Borough.

POOLS: All Pools (temporary or permanent) capable of holding 24 inches of water or more, must meet the building code regulations of Dallastown Borough. Please fill out the building permit

TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE **STREETS & SIDEWALKS:**

application prior to setting up your pool.

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way.



GRASS GROWING IN THE CURBS &

SIDEWALKS: The sidewalks adjacent to your property are yours to maintain. Grass & weeds are to be removed from

curbing & sidewalks, including where the curb joins the street, and around utility poles & traffic signs. Help Dallastown Borough keep its small-town charm by removing the weeds from your sidewalks. Kindly refrain from discharging grass clippings into the streets or on the sidewalks.



VEHICLES: All vehicles parked outside of an enclosed structure (garage) shall be current with both inspection & registration, shall not

have flat tires or be dismantled and must be operable.



YARD SALE PERMIT: A permit is required, per Dallastown Borough Ordinance. You may stop into the Borough office at 175 E. Broad St. to purchase a permit, the cost is \$10.00.

DALLASTOWN – YOE WATER AUTHORITY

WATER INCREASE: Beginning January 1, 2020, all Dallastown – Yoe Water Authority customers will experience a 15% increase in their water bills. This is due to an increase received from Red Lion Municipal Authority for the purchase of water and major improvements being made throughout the water system. The water main on Main Street is being replaced along with the water tank on South Park Street.



INTERESTING FACTS

Did you know......

- 80% of the Earth's surface is covered by water
- Only 3% of the Earth's water is fresh water
- ONLY 1% of the Earth's water is suitable for drinking water
- algallon of oil can contaminate up to 1 MILLION gallons of water
- Using a commercial carwash reduces stormwater runoff pollution
- The behavior of individuals contributes MORE to water pollution than business, industry, and large public enterprise
- Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water

- The overuse of lawn fertilizers can contribute to excessive plant growth in our lakes and streams
- A typical city block generates more than 5 times more runoff than a wooded area of the same size

MS4 & YOU!! PROTECTING YOUR WATER SHED!!!

- **1. BECOME**...a volunteer and monitor water quality conditions, increase community awareness and help identify and restore problem sites.
- **2. ORGANIZE**...your own trash cleanup program in your community.
- **3. BUILD...**a rain garden. Rain gardens planted with native vegetation help reduce the negative impacts of stormwater runoff by soaking up excess rainwater.
- **4. START**...a storm drain marking project, by producing flyers or door hangers or find out if your community needs volunteers to place decals on storm drains.
- **5. GREENSCAPE**...your yard by implementing practices that help improve your lawn while conserving our resources.
- **6. HELP...**spread the word! The EPA website (cfpub.epa.gov/npstbx/index.html) contains numerous flyers on practices to reduce stormwater pollution. Do your research and talk to your neighbors, friends, and co-workers about what you have learned to help spread the message.

If you are interested in becoming an active participant in shaping Dallastown's historical preservation, plan to attend meetings which are held at 7PM, the first Thursday of each month, in the museum.

The museum is open for research and exploration during every open house. New this year will be a focus for each season. During April, May and June, the museum will feature Dallastown's role in the cigar making industry; how it shaped family life in the early 1900's. A short presentation will be followed by time for individuals to share family stories and pictures. It is the goal of the Historical Society to collect and preserve those stories in their archives.

In August, the focus will be on summer fun-church picnics, carnivals, fairs. October and December will highlight music in Dallastown: church orchestras, bands, musical groups, musicians. Plan to attend each month, bring family stories and pictures, and explore the museum's collection of memorabilia.

Penn Waste would like to issue a reminder to residents in south central Pennsylvania that pool chemicals should NOT be disposed of in your curbside trash and recycling bins. Pool chemicals are considered hazardous waste and need to be disposed of properly.

As noted by the EPA, pool chemicals are hazardous because when they mix with a small quantity of water or are improperly mixed, such as with other chemicals or reactive materials, they can ignite causing fires. They can also cause skin irritation and release toxic vapors.

Many pool chemicals are highly reactive and capable of generating high temperatures which will start fires. Reactivity may be triggered by water wetting the chemical or by the inadvertent mixing of pool chemicals with an incompatible material.

When pool chemicals are disposed of in the trash or recycling, there is a high risk of them reacting because they **will** come in contact with other liquids in our trucks. Rain, high humidity, and other general liquids disposed of in your trash and recycling can cause the pool chemicals to react when they get collected by our truck resulting in a truck fire.

The Solution

Do not place pool chemicals in your trash and recycling! Here are several options for getting rid of pool chemicals:

- Take them to a facility that handles hazardous waste. Make sure you check with your local solid waste authority to see if they accept pool chemicals prior to arriving.
- York County Solid Waste Authority
- Check with the pool store you originally bought them from to see if they have a disposal method.
- Donate them to a community pool or your neighbors who have pools.
- Shock your pool by dumping the left over pool chemicals in before you close it for the season.

No Bake Summer Berry Icebox Cake

Ingredients

- 19 oz graham crackers
- 8 oz cream cheese, softened
- 2 (3.4 oz) packages Vanilla Instant Pudding
- 2-1/2 cups cold milk
- 12 oz Cool whip (or homemade whipped cream)
- 3 cups fresh strawberries, sliced
- 1-1/2 cups fresh blueberries
- 2 oz white chocolate chips

Instructions


- 1. Beat cream cheese and dry pudding mixes in large bowl with mixer until blended.
- 2. Gradually beat in milk.
- 3. Gently stir in Cool Whip or homemade whipped cream, reserving ½ cup.
- 4. Spread a thin layer of cool whip in a 9x13 pan just to coat the bottom.
- 5. Layer 5 graham crackers across the center of the pan, then 2 more, breaking them as needed to fit around the top and bottom edges.
- 6. Spread a layer of pudding mixture over grahams and top with a layer of blueberries and sliced strawberries.
- 7. Place graham crackers on top of berries, then pudding mixture, then layer of berries again.
- 8. Repeat the graham-pudding-berries layers 1 more time (3 times total) and you should reach the top of the pan.
- 9. Refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight until the graham crackers have softened completely.
- 10. When ready to serve, melt white chocolate chips in a bowl as directed on package and drizzle over dessert.
- 11. You can use a spoon to drizzle it over the tops of the berries or you can put it into a small zip-top bag and snip of the corner for an easy "piping bag."

Facts About Ladybugs

- 1. Ladybugs are beetles and are considered an insect because of their 6 legs.
- 2. They eat Aphids, which are insects that suck juices out of plants. Some also eat leaves. Since they eat Aphids, they are actually very helpful to have in your garden!
- 3. Ladybugs are not poisonous, but they can be toxic to some animals.
- 4. Different ladybugs have different number of spots. Some have no spots at all! The spots do not determine how old a ladybug is.
- 5. Ladybugs come in many colors: pink, yellow, white, orange, black and red.
- 6. To protect themselves against predators, they sometimes play dead. They also can release a small amount of blood from their legs, which has a bad smell. Their bright colors also warn predators to stay away.
- 7. Ladybugs have wings and they do fly.
- 8. They smell with their feet and antennas.
- 9. Female ladybugs are larger than male ladybugs.
- 10. The color of a ladybug's spots fade as it gets older.
