I like to keep you updated on any criminal problems we are having. I attended the August council meeting and had reviewed the crime data from YARPD for the month of June. It was a fairly normal report with a few thefts and a burglary. We did have two more serious personal crimes. At this time, I don't have much information on those two incidents. The most important thing to remember is that we all have to be on the lookout for unusual things that are out of place in our neighborhoods. If you see something that does not look right, call the police, they will look into it as that is what we pay the police to do.

**SIDEWALKS** – Snow/ice is to be removed from the sidewalks within 24 hours after a winter storm ceases. Properties at street intersections: **please** clear the snow that piles up at the sidewalk corners. This will help school children, the postal service and other pedestrians safely cross the street. We ask those who do not have sidewalks to follow this as well.

**PLOWING STREETS** – Please keep trees & shrubs cut back from the roadway, or the roadway may not be plowed. The snow plows will be plowing snow from “curb to curb” to remove as much snow from the streets as possible. This process takes time so please have patience and bear with us as we work to clear the streets as quickly as we can. When removing snow from your sidewalks, do not shovel the snow into the streets.

**\*\*In heavy snow storms, plows will be clearing driving lanes as quickly as possible and then will go back to work on clearing the sides/shoulders of the roads from curb to curb. Unfortunately, this sometimes pushes snow back on to your sidewalks which you may already have shoveled. If this occurs, we apologize for the inconvenience and added work that it may cause you, but it is essential to make our streets safe.**

In the event of a **Snow Emergency**, announcements will be made on **WGAL-TV 8, FOX 43, ABC 27 WHTM, CBS 21, WARM 103.3, 96.1 WSOX, FROGGY 107.7, ROCKY 98.5** and the local newspapers.

**NO PARKING** will be allowed on the “snow emergency routes” when an emergency is declared. Vehicles that are not moved will be towed at the vehicle owner’s expense.

### ***Snow Emergency Routes:***

The following streets shall be declared snow emergency routes: (Streets are posted)

- Main St.
- South side of W. Maple St. from Borough Line to N. Walnut St.
- South side of E. Maple St. from N. Walnut St. to N. Park St.
- N. Walnut St. from Main St. to Maple St.
- S. Walnut (WEST SIDE ONLY) from Main St. to E. Gay St.
- E. Gay St. (SOUTH SIDE ONLY) from S. Walnut St. to S. Pleasant Ave.
- N. Pleasant Ave. from Main St. to E. Broad St.
- E. Broad St. from N. Pleasant Ave. to N. Lombard St.
- N. Lombard St. from E. Broad St. to Borough Line
- S. Pleasant Ave. from Main St. to Borough Line
- N. Park St. from Main St. to E. Maple St.



Temporary parking is available at the following locations when a snow emergency is in effect: Fire Company parking lot, High School and Elementary School parking lots and Bethlehem United Methodist Church, Christ Lutheran Church and St. Paul’s United Church of Christ parking lots.



## LEAF COLLECTION IN THE BOROUGH

Leaf collection will run  
from October 18<sup>th</sup> through  
December 11<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting.

Please remember to rake them as close to the edge of the curb as possible away from cars, fences, posts or poles. **Tree limbs, sticks, shrub or hedge trimmings, grass, stones, dog waste, or any other foreign objects are not to be deposited in the leaves; otherwise the leaves will not be collected.** Thank you for your cooperation.

SWIFT911 is a new way for the borough to contact all of our water subscribers and our residents at any given time in case of an emergency such as water main breaks in your area, snow emergencies, hydrant flushing, etc.

If you are not receiving notifications, all you need to do is provide your contact information. Signing up on SWIFT911 is free, quick, and very helpful for you and the borough. ## TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALKS.....

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way, no less than 6 feet.



## SPRING STREET SWEEPING

Please remember to keep your sidewalks clear for street sweeping this year. If your walks are not cleared, a "Quality of Life" violation can and will be issued.

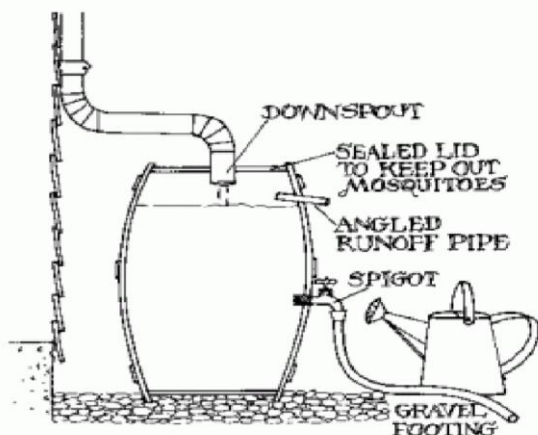

## RECYCLABLES & HOW TO PREPARE THEM

### CARDBOARD

#### Corrugated Cardboard and Shipping Boxes Only

Remove all packaging inside the box (such as peanuts, bubble wrap, etc.).

Flatten ALL boxes



### PAPER

#### Newspapers Only



Cover loose papers with heavier items in the container to prevent them from

blowing away.

### PLASTIC BOTTLES

**Plastic Water, Juice & Soda Bottles  
Plastic Containers & Bottles #1, #2 & #5 – This may include items such as shampoo bottles, Liquid detergent containers, condiment bottles, etc. Please check the container to find the designated number. (The neck of the bottle should be smaller than the base.)**



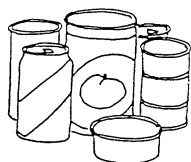
Remove caps or lids.

Rinse thoroughly to remove any residue.

Labels & neck rings do not need to be removed from containers.

### METAL & ALUMINUM

#### Aluminum Cans, Steel Cans & Food Containers



Rinse thoroughly to remove any residue.

### CARTONS

Cartons are defined as a type of packaging that food & beverage products come in that you purchase at the store.

There are 2 types of cartons:

**Shelf-Stable Cartons** – include juice, milk, soy milk, soup & broth, and wine cartons. These are cartons that do not need to be kept cold.

**Refrigerated Cartons** – include milk, juice, cream and egg substitute cartons. These items must be kept cold.

Be sure to remove straws.

Make sure carton is empty and rinsed out.

Cartons may be placed in your bin along with all other recyclables.

### GLASS

#### Food & Beverage Glass only Clear brown, blue & green glass food & beverage containers



Rinse thoroughly to remove any residue.

Remove any plastic caps or tops.

Labels do not need to be removed.

### 2021 TOWN & TREE LIGHTING & CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PARTY

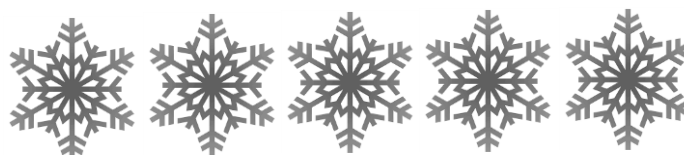

So, mark your calendar and join us for a fun evening! This is a free event sponsored by Dallastown Recreation.



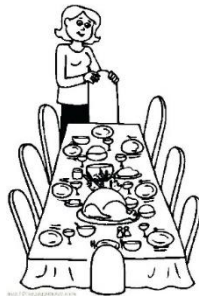

Also, make sure your generators are serviced, all family members have an ICE (in case of emergency) contact in their mobile devices, and know your shelter location. It is very important to make sure all family members know how to dial 911 when there is a life threatening emergency. Checking on your neighbors is always a good idea too. And don't forget your furry family members.....they also need a "Go Bag" and shelter placement along with a contact list including the veterinarian.

Not only do we need to worry about the preparation of our residential community, but also our community businesses need to ask themselves.....how prepared are we? What is your "Ready to Go Plan"? 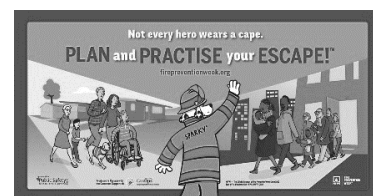

### ***York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc.***

(formerly Yoe Ambulance Service) has been serving from Yoe Fire Company (now SAFER Station 2) since 1972 and from

Goodwill Fire Co since 2004. We serve a primary population of 40,000+ people residing in four municipalities Yoe Borough, Dallastown Borough, Windsor Township and York Township. We provide 24-hour Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulance service from each station. Peak-hour units are staffed from 6 AM to 6 PM, weekdays, to enhance the level of service provided during this high demand period.

York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc. is a non-profit, 501(c)3, charitable organization incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We are licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Health and are dispatched by the York County Department of Emergency Services - 911 Center.

The 2022 Annual Subscription requests will be mailed in March. While many Subscriptions expire at different times during the year, the bulk of our Subscribers are on an annual cycle for each spring. The Subscription is available to the residents and businesses of Yoe and Dallastown Boroughs, and those portions of York and Windsor Townships serviced by York Regional EMS. If you have questions or you are new to the area, call us at 717-246-3679, Monday through Thursday between 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM.

#### ***Why Should I Buy an Ambulance Subscription?***

##### **Peace of Mind in an Emergency:**

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital or will pay for only those fees they consider to be "usual and customary." Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion, of the fees not covered by private insurance, becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.


As a *York Regional EMS Subscriber*, we will only bill Primary and Secondary Insurance providers. Payment from a subscriber's insurance carrier will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs\*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to York Regional EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. This subscription is also honored by 8 neighboring EMS agencies shown below:

West York Ambulance, Jacobus Ambulance, Red Lion Ambulance, Southern York County EMS, Eureka Fire and Ambulance, Rose Fire Company (New Freedom) and Grantley Fire and EMS

*\*All patients will be responsible for a minimum charge of \$95 for refusal of transport, when evaluation and/or treatment is provided. Non-transport is not covered by the subscription.*

## **FIRE SAFETY AT HOME**



### **ELIMINATE HAZARDS**

- Keep space heaters away from anything that can burn
- Store all flammable materials away from heat
- Don't let trash accumulate in attic, basement or garage
- Don't run extension cords behind rugs or curtains
- Use fuses, circuit breakers and appliances with UL (Underwriters Laboratory) seal only
- Don't overload circuits

### **FIRE PREVENTION**


- Keep operational fire extinguishers handy
- Install and maintain smoke detectors

### **DEVELOP ESCAPE PLAN**

- Develop and memorize escape route
- Assign responsibility for evacuating infants, elderly and infirm
- Choose meeting place outside home
- Keys must be easily accessible
- Hold frequent fire drills
- Test every door, be sure there's no fire on the other side

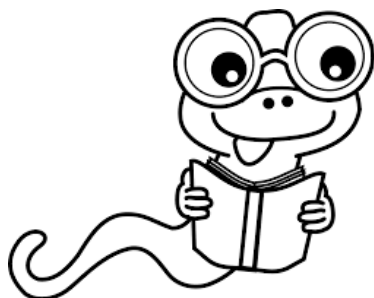

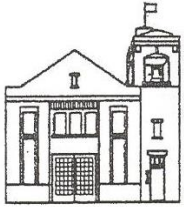

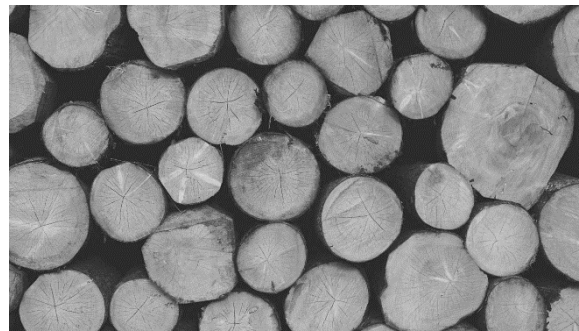

# GET READY FOR WINTER...

## TREE BRANCHES

Check tree branches and trim those close to the house or power lines.

## HOSES & FAUCETS

Disconnect hoses and store inside. Locate the main water shut-off valve and know how to use it. Wrap outside pipes and spigots.

## FURNACE

Clean/replace your filter every 4-6 weeks. Check all fireplaces, chimneys and flues.

## THERMOSTAT

Make sure you keep your house heated to at least 60 degrees, even when you're not home. Consider installing programmable thermostats to regulate temperature.

## ROOF & GUTTERS

Check for loose shingles and flashing. Clean out gutters and downspouts.

## PIPES

If the temperature drops below 20 degrees, let water trickle in all faucets.

## WINDOWS & DOORS

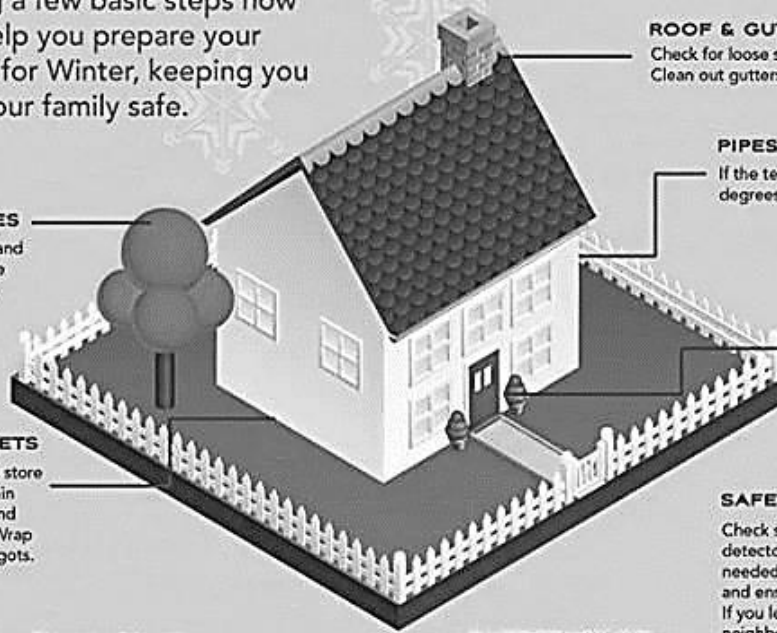
Check weatherstripping, patch or caulk as needed. Consider thick drapes to help keep heat inside.

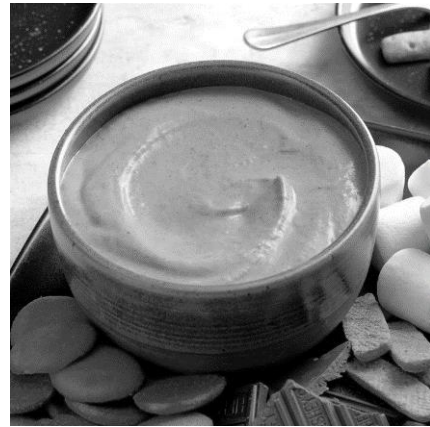

- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- Optional: vanilla wafers, graham cracker sticks, chocolate and marshmallows

### Directions

- In a small bowl, beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Gradually add the pumpkin, caramel topping, sour cream, cinnamon and nutmeg, beating until smooth. Serve with dippers of your choice. Refrigerate leftovers.

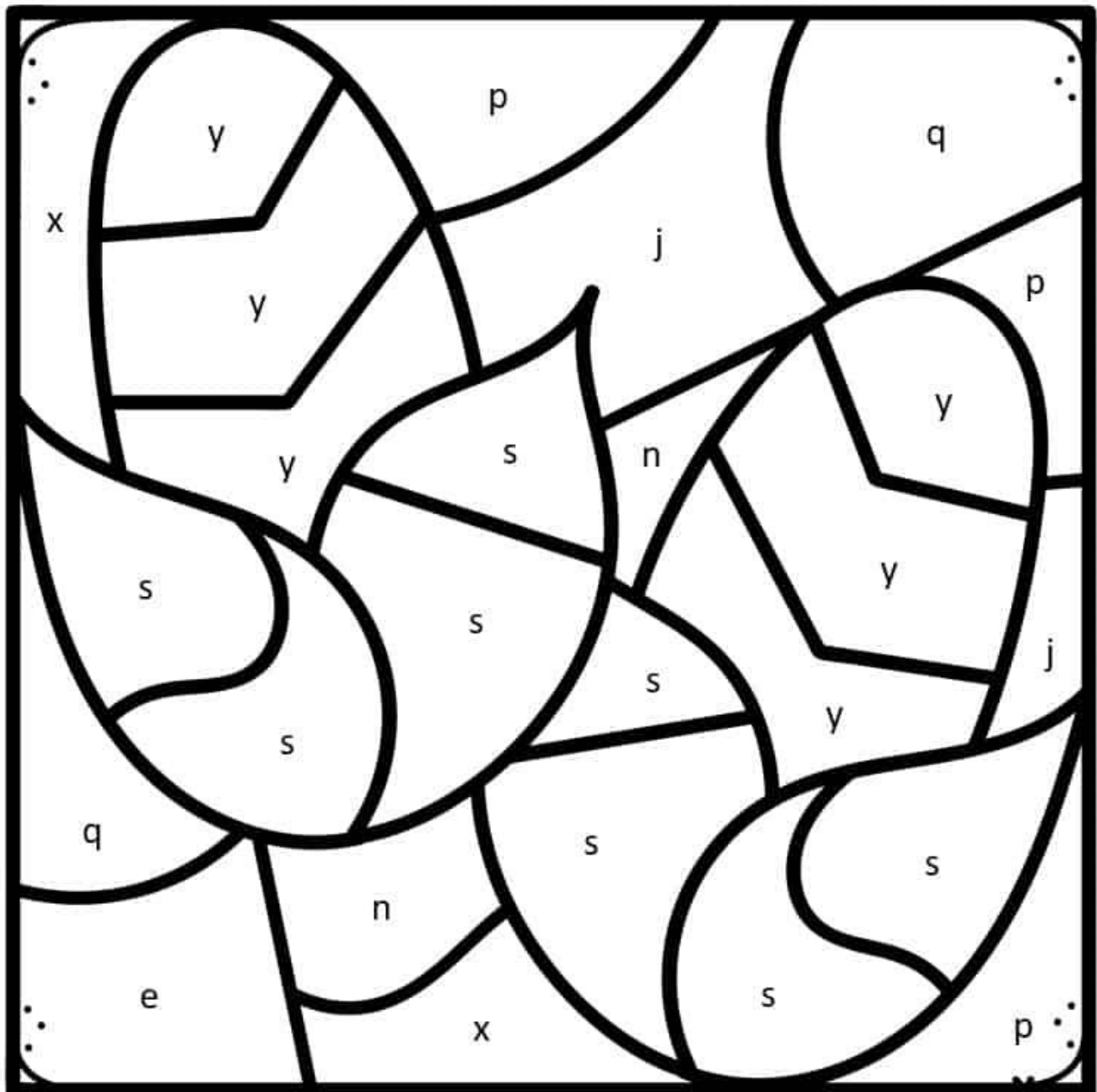
