<u>SIDEWALKS</u> – Snow/ice is to be removed from the sidewalks within 24 hours after a winter storm ceases. Properties at street intersections: **PLEASE** clear the snow that piles up at the sidewalk corners. This will help school children, the postal service and other pedestrians safely cross the street. We ask those who do not have sidewalks to follow this as well.

<u>PLOWING STREETS</u> – Please keep trees & shrubs cut back from the roadway, or the roadway may not be plowed. The snow plows will be plowing snow from "curb to curb" to remove as much snow from the streets as possible. This process takes time so please have patience and bear with us as we work to clear the streets as quickly as we can. When removing snow from your sidewalks, do not shovel the snow into the streets, this is prohibited by borough ordinance.

**In heavy snowstorms, plows will be clearing driving lanes as quickly as possible and will then go back to work on clearing the sides/shoulders of the roads from curb to curb. Unfortunately, this sometimes pushes snow back on to your sidewalks which you may already have shoveled. If this occurs, we apologize for the inconvenience and added work that it may cause you, but it is essential to make our streets safe.

In the event of a Snow Emergency, announcements will be made on WGAL-TV 8, FOX 43, ABC 27 WHTM, CBS 21, WARM 103.3, 96.1 WSOX, FROGGY 107.7, ROCKY 98.5 and the local newspapers.

NO PARKING will be allowed on the "snow emergency routes" when an emergency is declared. Vehicles that are not moved will be towed at the vehicle owner's expense.

Snow Emergency Routes:

The following streets shall be declared snow emergency routes: (Streets are posted)

- Main St.
- South side of W. Maple St. from Borough Line to N. Walnut St.
- South side of E. Maple St. from N. Walnut St. to N. Park St.
- N. Walnut St. from Main St. to Maple St.
- S. Walnut (WEST SIDE ONLY) from Main St. to E. Gay St.
- E. Gay St. (SOUTH SIDE ONLY) from S. Walnut St. to S. Pleasant Ave.
- N. Pleasant Ave. from Main St. to E. Broad St.
- E. Broad St. from N. Pleasant Ave. to N. Lombard St.
- N. Lombard St. from E. Broad St. to Borough Line
- S. Pleasant Ave. from Main St. to Borough Line
- N. Park St. from Main St. to E. Maple St.



Temporary parking is available at the following locations when a snow emergency is in effect: SAFER parking lot, High School and Elementary School parking lots, Bethlehem Church, Christ Lutheran Church and Truth Tabernacle 7th Day Adventist Church parking lots.

LEAF COLLECTION IN THE BOROUGH

Leaf collection will run from October 20th through December 5th, weather permitting.

Please remember to rake them as close to the edge of the curb as possible away from cars, fences, posts, or poles.

Tree limbs, sticks, shrubs or hedge trimmings, grass, stones, dog waste, or any other foreign objects are not to be deposited in the leaves. Otherwise, the leaves will not be collected. Thank you for your cooperation.



STREET LIGHTS

If you see a streetlight in the Borough that is out or not working properly, please contact the Borough office at 244-6626. We are not always around at night to see the problems first-hand, so any help would be greatly appreciated.

A Per Capita Tax of \$10.00 is levied upon each resident of the Borough who

TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALK.......

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed no less than 15ft over the street and 6ft over the sidewalk. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way and sidewalk as to not interfere with traffic & travel.



SPRING STREET SWEEPING

Please remember to keep your sidewalks clear for street sweeping this year. This means having your sidewalks swept of any salt or cinders so it can be removed when the sweeper comes through. If your walks are not cleared, a "Quality of Life" violation can and will be issued.

DON'T FORGET.....

Disconnect your garden hose from the outside faucet when the temperature drops.



What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is the precipitation that flows across the ground after it rains or when snow and ice melt. Stormwater can become an issue as it picks up debris, dirt, and chemicals when it flows. It can also cause flooding that erodes stream banks. This polluted stormwater is collected in our



storm sewer systems which are made up of pipes and roadside ditches. All the stormwater collected eventually makes it to our streams, lakes, and wetlands. Since stormwater is not treated, the pollutants that have been collected make it back into our waters!

- Directing flow into vegetated areas
- Planting Trees
- Use Rain Barrels

- Porous Pavement
- Infiltration Trenches
- Pick up Pet Waste
- Maintain your vehicle

- •Use Pesticides and Fertilizers Correctly

RECYCLABLES & HOW TO PREPARE THEM

CARDBOARD

Corrugated Cardboard and Shipping Boxes Only

Remove all packaging inside the box (such as peanuts, bubble wrap, etc.). Flatten ALL boxes





<u>PAPER</u> Newspapers Only

Cover loose papers with heavier items in the container to prevent them from blowing away.

PLASTIC BOTTLES

Plastic Water, Juice & Soda Bottles Plastic Containers & Bottles #1, #2 & #5 – This may include items such as shampoo bottles, Liquid



detergent containers, condiment bottles, etc. Please check the container to find the designated number. (The neck of the bottle should be smaller than the base.)

Remove caps or lids.

Rinse thoroughly to remove any residue.

Labels & neck rings do not need to be removed from containers.



METAL & ALUMINUM

Aluminum Cans, Steel Cans & Food Containers

Rinse thoroughly to remove any residue.

Remove any plastic caps or tops unless they are part of the can.

Labels do not need to be removed from cans.



CARTONS



Cartons are defined as a type of packaging that food & beverage products come in that you purchase at the store.

There are 2 types of cartons:

Shelf-Stable Cartons – soup & broth, and wine cartons.

These are cartons that do not need to be kept cold.

Refrigerated Cartons – include milk, juice, cream and egg substitute cartons. These items must be kept cold.

Be sure to remove straws.

Make sure carton is empty and rinsed out. Cartons may be placed in your bin along with all other recyclables.

GLASS

Food & Beverage Glass only Clear brown, blue & green glass food & beverage containers



Rinse thoroughly to remove any residue.

Remove any plastic caps or tops. Labels do not need to be removed.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

The following items are NOT recyclable:

Food-Soiled Materials Broken Glass Drinking Glasses Scrap Metal Needles & Medical Waste

Windows, Mirrors & Ceramics

Aluminum Foil

Plastic Tableware (Knives, Forks, etc.)

Plastic Bags (including grocery bags)

Shredded Paper

Light Bulbs

Soaked and/or Wet Papers or Cardboard

Plastic Food Wrappers

POLICY FOR LARGE ITEM PICKUP

For large items to be acceptable, they must be able to be lifted into a truck by two people. Loose piles cannot be accepted. You must call Penn Waste to arrange your large item pickup (717) 767-4456.

Acceptable Items

- Appliances such as Refrigerators and Washing Machines
- Carpet (48"max. length, rolled and tied)
- Furniture
- Mattresses & Box Springs
- Car Tires (TIRES ONLY. Must be removed from rims)
- Scrap Metal (48"max. length)

Non-Acceptable Items

- Paints, Stain, Chemicals and Liquids
- Batteries
- Automobile Parts
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Tires on Rims
- Commercial and Industrial Waste
- Construction Materials or Debris, including: Drywall, Brick, Block, Treated Lumber, Roofing, Shingles, Ceiling Tiles, Concrete

Open Houses are held the first Sunday of the month from 1 pm to 4 pm unless otherwise noted. Dates are posted on our website as well as the marquee facing Main Street.

Sunday, October 5th Tour of Historic Churches in Dallastown: Five of the six church buildings are within walking distance. Visitors may pick up a map and begin the tour at the Historical Society building or St John's Blymire's UCC, Christ Lutheran, Bethlehem Life, or St Joseph's Catholic Churches. These four sites will invite visitors inside to view their sanctuaries, provide tour maps, and allow parking at their sites that day. The other two sites are walking by. Rain or Shine, events will be held.

Thursday, October 16th Dallastown Recreation Halloween Parade: DHS will sponsor a float in the parade with a theme befitting both the holiday and our purpose.

Saturday, November 1st Christmas in Dallastown: The historical society museum will be decorated for Christmas and open to visitors from 9 am to 3 pm. Dallastown books and cutouts will be available for purchase.

Sunday, November 2nd Open House to allow more time for visitors from the 1st to view our collections.

Sunday, December 7th Christmas Open House: View our exhibits and collections adorned with holiday decorations.

In 2026, our Sunday Open Houses from 1 pm to 4 pm on January 4th, February 1st, and March 1st will feature Dallastown Recollections. Each month at 1:30 pm a speaker will briefly introduce a topic with their recollections, then open the floor for other participants to share memories and photos or artifacts. The legacy of John H Myers in Dallastown will be one of the topics. The others are yet to be determined. As always, museum displays and collections will be available to visit.

WILL YOU NEED **HELP WITH RAKING AND** SHOVELING?

York County older adults aged 60+, who are interested in getting help with fall cleanup, raking, snow shoveling, or with other household chores are encouraged to arrange for help from a Rent-A-Kid. The Rent-A-Kid program is sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging. This is an "intergenerational program" that connects York County older adults who need help, and nearby middle and high school students in grades 7-12, who want to help. The goal of the Rent-A-Kid program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between older adults and youth.

Older adults in need of assistance can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator, Hope Eberly, at 717-771-9103, who will provide names and phone numbers for youth nearby who may be interested. It is the responsibility of the older adult to contact the youth and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made. The older adult needs to be agreeable to a reimbursement of a minimum of \$5/hour, or a negotiated rate based on the job.

Middle and high school students in grades 7-12 who are interested in participating should contact their local school guidance counselor for the application. Recognizing the signs of a scam can help you avoid falling victim to one. These scams primarily use telephone to contact you, but scammers may also use email, text message, social media, or U.S. mail.

TIPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- **1. Do not take immediate action.** If you receive a communication that causes a strong emotional response, take a deep breath. Hang up or ignore the message. Talk to someone you trust.
- **2. Do not transfer your money!** Do not buy that gift card! Never pay someone who insists that you pay with a gift card, prepaid debit card, Internet currency or cryptocurrency, wire transfer, money transfer, or by mailing cash. Scammers use these forms of payment because they are hard to trace.
- **3. Be skeptical.** Do not believe scammers who "transfer" your call to a government official or law enforcement officer. Scammers can create fake numbers and identities. Do not trust your caller ID. Do not provide your personal information, even if the caller has some of your information.
- 4. Do not click on links or attachments.
