BOROUGH NEWS.....



FLUSHING: The Dallastown-Yoe Water Authority will begin flushing hydrants on May 12th. Please be aware that some discoloration of the water may occur, and you may be without water for short periods of time during the flushing procedure. **Make sure your water is not discolored before doing laundry.**

STREET SWEEPING: Borough Maintenance will be starting street sweeping (Alleys) on Monday, April 14th and (Main Roads) on Monday, April 21st depending on the weather. Please have your sidewalks cleaned before street sweeping begins.



POTHOLES:

With the winter that we've had, it's almost a guarantee that there will be potholes throughout the Borough. If you happen to discover any, that Borough Maintenance has not, please contact the Borough Office at 244-6626. Thanks so much for your help!



STREETLIGHTS:

If you happen to see a streetlight that is out or not functioning properly, please contact the Borough Office. We are not always around at night to see the problems first-hand, so any help would be greatly appreciated. We will contact Met Ed to have them fixed.



TAX COLLECTOR:

Linda Shaub, the Dallastown Borough Tax Collector will be at the Borough Office on Monday, April 14th from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm and Tuesday, April 15th from noon to 2:00 pm. She will be located in the Council Room to the rear of the building. Please enter thru the double glass doors on the side of the building.



PET OWNERS: When walking your pets, please be responsible and clean up after them. Also remember your pets must be leashed, and under your control at all times when not on your property. Thank you!



RENTAL UNITS: All residential rental units must be registered and inspected by the Borough. If you have a rental, or plan to rent your property, please call the Borough office for details.



VEHICLES: All vehicles parked outside of an enclosed structure (garage) shall be current with both inspection & registration, shall not have flat tires or be dismantled and must be operable.

POOLS: All Pools (temporary or permanent) capable of holding 24 inches of water or more must meet the building code regulations of Dallastown Borough. Please fill out the building permit application prior to setting up your pool.



TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALKS:

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way.



GRASS GROWING IN THE CURBS & SIDEWALKS:

Help Dallastown Borough keep its small-town charm by removing the weeds from your sidewalks. The sidewalks adjacent to your property are yours to maintain. Grass & weeds are to be removed from curbing & sidewalks. This includes where the curb joins the street and around utility poles & traffic signs. Kindly refrain from discharging grass clippings into the streets or on the sidewalks.



GRASS GROWING IN EXCESS OF 8 INCHES ON YOUR PROPERTY:

Grass & other vegetation shall be maintained to a height of no more than 8 inches on your property. Poison ivy and other nuisance "weeds" shall be removed as well.



If your property falls into a non-compliance state, a violation letter will be sent by certified mail to the owner or tenants who reside on the property. If the nuisances still exist, a non-traffic citation will be issued each day the property is in non-compliance.

YARD SALE PERMIT:

A permit is required per Dallastown Borough Ordinance. You may stop into the Borough office at 175 E. Broad St. to purchase a permit, the cost is \$10.00.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

Penn Waste would like to issue a reminder to residents in south central Pennsylvania that pool chemicals should NOT be disposed of in your curbside trash and recycling bins. Pool chemicals are considered hazardous waste and need to be disposed of properly.

Bulk Item Guidelines - Call to Schedule Pickup @ 717-767-4456



Dallastown Borough residents may dispose of one (1) bulk item per week on Thursday. Please contact Penn Waste to schedule your bulk item for collection. Please have your bulk item available for collection at the curb by 6:00 AM.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS – Appliances, furniture, mattresses, box springs, one (1) car tire without the rim, lawn mowers (oil and gasoline removed), plumbing fixtures such as toilets and sinks, three (3) 4 ft. rolls of carpet (tied). Items too heavy to be lifted into truck by two people will not be accepted. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

Trash, Recycling, and one item (on schedule dates) must be curb side by 6 am on your scheduled collection day. No more than two containers will be collected each week. Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 60 pounds.

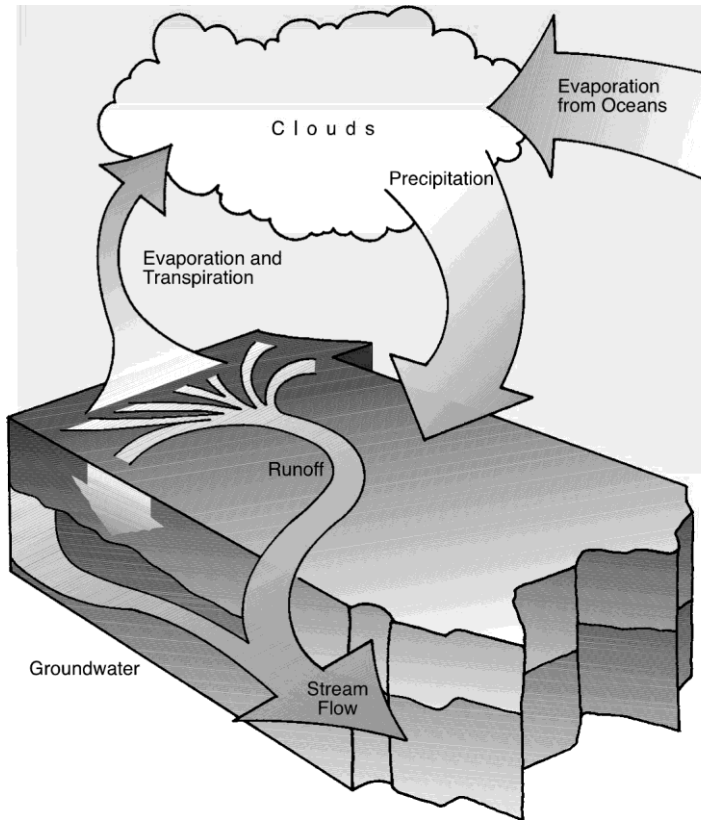
Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will shift the whole week by one day.

EXCEPTION: If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

Holidays Observed:

- Memorial Day – Trash & recycling pickup Tuesday May 27th, trash pickup Friday May 30th.
- Labor Day - Trash & recycling pickup Tuesday September 2nd, trash pickup Friday September 5th.
- Thanksgiving Day – Trash pickup Friday November 28th.
- Christmas Day – Trash pickup Friday December 26th.

MS4- PROTECTING YOUR WATER SHED



BECOME a volunteer and monitor water quality conditions, increase community awareness and help identify and restore problem sites.

ORGANIZE your own trash cleanup program in your community.

BUILD a rain garden. Rain gardens planted with native vegetation help reduce the negative impacts of stormwater runoff by soaking up excess rainwater.

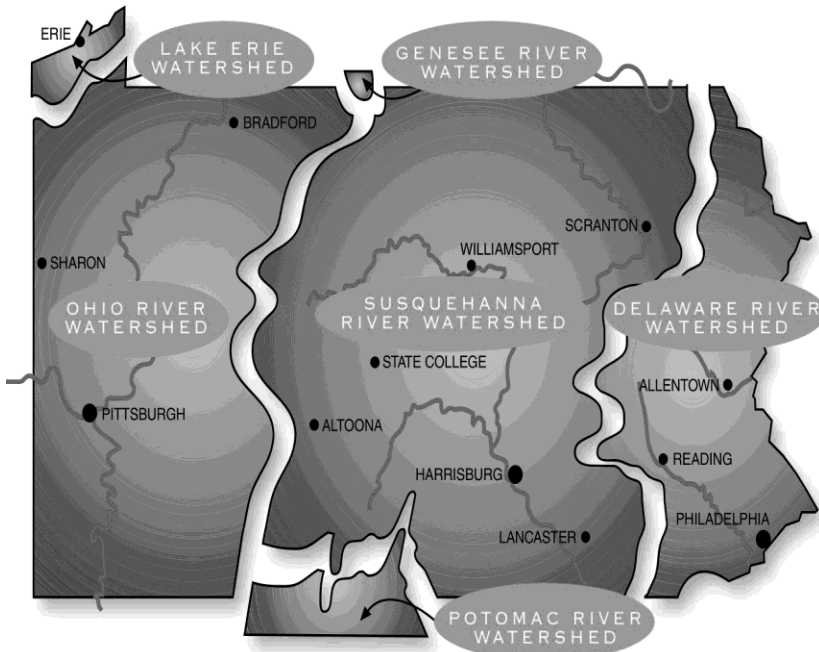
START a storm drain marking project by producing flyers or door hangers or find out if your community needs volunteers to place decals on storm drains.

GREENSCAPE your yard by implementing practices that help improve your lawn while conserving our watershed.

HELP spread the word! Do your research and talk to your neighbors, friends, and co-workers about what you have learned to help spread the message.

Pennsylvania contains almost 83,000 miles of streams, ranging from small trickles to large rivers. All of these streams are important because they provide

water for people, farms, and industries. They are home to many kinds of wildlife and fish. Streams also give us great places to go fishing, swimming, and boating.



Streams receive water from the land that surrounds them. The land area through which any water moves or drains to reach a stream is called a watershed. Dallastown Borough has two

distinct drainage areas. Water runoff either flows north to Mill Creek or south to Inners and Barshinger Creek. The water from these streams ultimately joins up in the Coderus Creek which is in the Susquehanna River Watershed.



Pennsylvania Urban Nutrient Management - Spring Greening

Spring to Life

As the snow slowly melts away, the birds begin to sing and fresh life bursts from the soil heralding the approach of Spring and the lawn maintenance season. For the 1 million-plus acres of home lawns in Pennsylvania, selecting and implementing an appropriate lawncare management program to promote healthy and aesthetically pleasing lawns is not only important to homeowners, but is also essential to protecting our waterways.

Know What's Best. Soil Test!

The first step to understanding what your lawn really needs to be lush, healthy, and green is to know what your soil needs. It is important to conduct regular soil tests to determine nutrient deficiencies that should guide fertilizer selection and application. Soil test kits can be purchased for a nominal fee from your local Penn State Extension office.

Following soil test recommendations, reading fertilizer label instructions, and using a properly calibrated spreader will ensure the right amount of nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium are applied, while reducing nutrient loss and fertilizer cost.

Soil Health. It's the bottom line.

Maintaining a happy, healthy soil is imperative to your lawn's success. Soil is the foundation for your lawn and is home to a multitude of microorganisms that are essential for plant growth. Take the time to support your soil by incorporating some simple practices into your lawn care program. Your lawn and wallet will thank you.

- Keep it open. Routine soil aeration can help reduce soil compaction. Good soil structure is essential for proper root growth, healthy microbe communities, and the movement and exchange of water, air, and nutrients.
- Raise it up. Maintain a taller lawn by only cutting 1/3 of the grass blade with each mowing. Taller lawns slow runoff and promote deeper roots, which reduces lawn stress and improves soil structure.
- Put it back. Return nutrients and organic matter back to the soil by mulching your leaves and grass clippings.

For more soil management strategies, contact your local county conservation district or Penn State Extension office.

Green Lawns – Clean Streams

Pennsylvania's 2022 Fertilizer Law amendments were developed to protect Pennsylvania waterways and the waterways downstream. As a bonus, following the limitations in the law will boost your bottom line by ensuring that your investment doesn't wash away. The 2022 law established the following nitrogen and phosphorus limits for turf fertilizer applications. Good soil structure has adequate pore space between soil particles to allow for the movement of air, water, and nutrients into the root zone.

- Nitrogen is limited to 0.9 pounds of total nitrogen and 0.7 pounds of available nitrogen per 1000 ft² per application.
- No phosphorus can be applied unless establishing or repairing turf.
- Nitrogen and phosphorus rates can be adjusted based on soil test recommendations and/or if using an enhanced-efficiency fertilizer.

In addition to the nutrient limitations, the law also established application parameters to prevent direct movement of fertilizer nutrients into our streams:

- Do not apply fertilizer if a heavy rain event is expected.
- Keep fertilizer away from drainage ditches, storm drains, or water. Maintain a 15-foot buffer from the banks of all waterways.
- Remove fertilizer that lands on impervious surfaces (driveways, sidewalks, roads, parking lots).

Working Together for Clean Water

With ever growing acres of managed turf in Pennsylvania, controlling what goes into PA waterways is ALL of our responsibility. Help protect Pennsylvania's waterways by being wise when you fertilize! 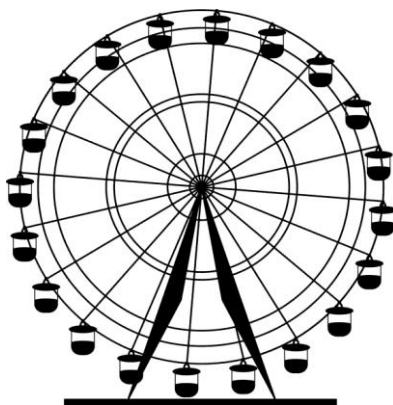

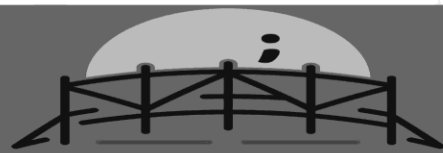

WHAT IS A QPR GATEKEEPER

A gatekeeper is someone in a position to recognize a crisis and the warning signs that someone may be contemplating suicide.

QPR Gatekeepers can be anyone, but include

- Parents
- Teachers
- Minister
- Youth
- Doctors
- First Responders
- Mental Health Professionals
- Community Members

AS A CERTIFIED QPR GATEKEEPER YOU WILL LEARN TO

1. Recognize the warning signs of suicide
2. Increase awareness of stigma and understand suicide as a public health issue
3. Know how to offer hope
4. Know how to access local and national referral resources
5. Know how to get help and save a life

COMMUNITY: York County Regional Police Department Is committed to serving our citizens and communities. We are looking for opportunities to grow and consolidate resources to better serve our communities.

MERGER: On February 13, 2025, the YCRPD Commission voted to merge with Spring Garden Township Police Department, bringing Spring Garden Township on as 4th Charter member of the commission. MOU’s have been signed so that officers from both departments may handle calls for service in either jurisdiction until the merger is complete on June 1, 2025. This merger will raise our officer compliment to over 80 sworn officers.

CONGRATULATIONS: At the January York County Regional Police commission meeting Officer Mathew Eckert was recognized by Police Chief Timothy Damon & Fire Chief Joseph Stevens, with Chief’s Commendation for his actions on November 30, 2024. Officer Eckert responded to a structure fire call, with entrapment, in the 400 block of Holly Dr. in East Manchester Township. Upon arrival Officer Eckert noticed a female within the residence who was leaning out of a window. Eckert attempted to extract the woman through the window but moved to a backdoor that was nearby. Officer Eckert was able to pry the back door open to allow the women to crawl through and get out of the home. At the February York County Regional Police commission meeting Corporal Christopher Glass was recognized by Police Chief Timothy Damon with a Chief’s Commendation for his actions on December 28, 2024. Corporal Glass responded to a bank robbery at the Orrstown bank on Cape Horn Rd.in Windsor Township. While responding, Corporal Glass received updated information on the location of the suspect vehicle but not a description of the vehicle. Corporal Glass observed a vehicle in the area with an occupant who was acting suspiciously. He observed the vehicle passing another vehicle on Winterstown Rd. Corporal Glass attempted to stop the vehicle while the occupant tossed cash out the window of the vehicle. Glass was able to get the vehicle stopped and arrested the suspect and recovered the money taken in the bank robbery.

EVENTS: On November 2024 we held a “Cram the Cruiser” food drive at GIANT Foods 3175 Cape Horn Rd. The food items collected were donated to the York County Food Bank.

K9 UNIT: Throughout Tango’s 3.5-year career between training and deployments he has searched for electronic devices over 2,500 times and has located over 10,000 devices. Tango had a productive 2024 and was deployed on multiple searches throughout York, Lancaster, Adams, Dauphin, and Cumberland County. Tango conducted searches for cases related to child exploitation, homicides, lost property, and prison/correctional facility searches. Dozens of electronic devices were located on these searches. He attended multiple PR events/demonstrations where we continue to raise awareness for the fight against child exploitation. Tango has been healthy & has had no medical issues since his medical scare earlier in 2024.

CRIME: Dallastown Borough – 3 masked black males assaulted and robbed the victim, stealing a vehicle and other items. One of the males had brandished a firearm. The vehicle was later recovered, suspects identified, and charges were filed.



National Night Out will be held by YCRPD on Tuesday, August 5th at Dallastown Community Park starting at 5:00 pm. Once again, the park will be filled with fun activities, crime prevention information, demonstrations, and entertainment.

STOP HOPPER: HOP ABOARD!

When communities have increased mobility options, residents have increased possibilities to improve their quality of life. Rabbittransit's **Stop Hopper** microtransit service, available in Red Lion, Dallastown, and East York, offers area residents the opportunity of greater mobility.

The Stop Hopper is a compact, neighborhood friendly-sized public transit vehicle. Unlike fixed route or shared ride, the Stop Hopper is designed for smaller, rural communities, allowing patrons to access the benefits of public transportation through a direct ride model.

Riders can travel anywhere within the Red Lion/Dallastown/East York service zone by requesting a ride using the Stop Hopper smartphone app. Following a ride request, the app provides an estimated pick-up time, tracks vehicles in real-time and alerts passengers when their ride is about to arrive. Passengers are picked up in a nine-person, ADA accessible van and taken where they want to go. The Stop Hopper app is available for download via the **App Store** or **Google Play**.

Operating hours range from 6:30am to 6:30pm, Monday through Friday. The service is free for seniors 65+ who possess a registered free fare ID card. Riders may also place a ride request by calling 1-800-632-9063, one hour before their desired pick-up time.

EASTER EGG HUNT

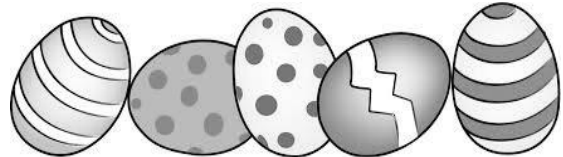

As a *First Capital EMS Subscriber*, payment from your insurance carrier(s) will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to First Capital EMS immediately upon receipt.

If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. This subscription is also honored by 5 neighboring EMS agencies shown below:

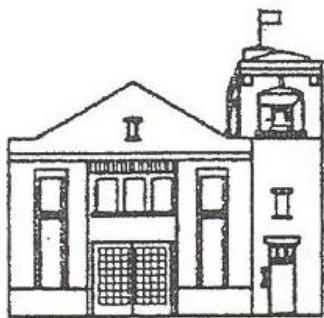

The changing climate is a force multiplier- increasing the number of storms, floods, fires, and extreme temperatures. That threatens the well-being of people across our nation and communities. Our Emergency Managers plan for and strategically invest in climate adaptation measures, the effects from disasters are less severe and the road to recovery starts sooner for survivors. FEMA National Risk Index- Is an online tool that helps illustrate the extreme weather events facing the nation and your community. Plan, now, and prepare - knowing your risk isn't enough. Checkout Homeland Security website "www.ready.gov" while preparing don't forget your furry family members.....they also need a "Go Bag" and shelter placement along with a contact list including the veterinarian. 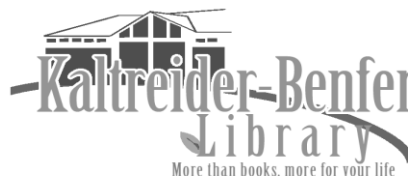

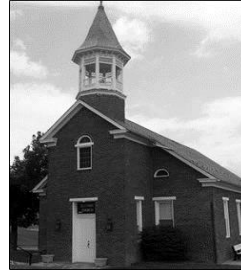
