Ordinance Update: Parking is prohibited on the lawn or landscaped areas.

By Ordinance # 591, Dallastown Borough Code Section 212-12-22.1 it is now unlawful to park a vehicle on a lawn or landscaped area, including private property. This has come about due to the increasing demand of awareness for stormwater runoff and management. In Dallastown Borough, vehicles may now only be parked on a stone, concrete, or a macadam pad. Vehicles may only be parked on the lawn or landscaped area when they are being washed.



Any questions about the new ordinance or any ordinance updates can be made by calling the Borough's zoning and codes officer. Thank you for you cooperation with this addition to the code!

TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALKS......

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up

about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way, no less than 6 feet.

GRASS GROWING IN THE CURBS & SIDEWALKS......

The sidewalks adjacent to your property are yours to maintain. Grass & weeds are to be removed from curbing & sidewalks,



including where the curb joins the street, and around utility poles & traffic signs.

Help Dallastown Borough keep its small-town charm by removing the weeds from your sidewalks. Kindly <u>refrain</u> from discharging grass clippings into the streets or on the sidewalks.

<u>What is Stormwater?</u>

Stormwater is the precipitation that flows across the ground after it rains or when snow and ice melt.

Stormwater can become an issue as it picks up debris, dirt, and chemicals when it flows. It can also cause flooding that erodes stream banks. This polluted stormwater is collected in our storm sewer systems which are made up of pipes and roadside ditches. All of the stormwater collected eventually makes it to our streams, lakes, and wetlands. Since stormwater is not treated, the pollutants that have been collected make it back into our waters!

What can we do to help?

- Properly dispose of hazardous waste, and never put them down the storm sewer drain
- Pick up after pets and dispose of their waste properly
- Use pesticides, fertilizers, and herbicides properly as to not create excess runoff
- Install residential stormwater systems such as rain gardens or rain barrels that keep the stormwater on site and not into the storm sewer system







Ingredients:

- ¼ lb (1 stick) unsalted butter @ room temperature
- 1 ½ cups sugar
- 2 extra-large eggs @ room temperature
- 1 cup sour cream @ room temperature
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 3 large ripe peaches, peeled, pitted & sliced
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans

Directions:

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 9inch square baking pan.
- In a bowl, beat the butter and 1 cup of the sugar for 3-5 minutes on medium-high speed, until light & fluffy.
- Turn mixer to low & add the eggs (one at a time), then the sour cream and vanilla. Mix until the batter is smooth.
- In a separate bowl, sift together the flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt.
- With the mixer of low, slowly add the dry ingredients to the batter and mix just until combined.
- In a small bowl, combine the remaining ½ cup of sugar and the cinnamon.
- Spread ½ of the batter evenly in the pan. Top with ½ of the peaches, then sprinkle with 2/3rds of the sugar mixture. Spread the remaining batter on top, arrange the remaining peaches on top & sprinkle with remaining sugar mixture and pecans
- Bake for 45-55 minutes




FUN BUTTERFLY FACTS

- A butterfly's lifecycle is made up of 4 parts, egg, larva (caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis) & adult.
- Butterflies attach their eggs to leaves with a special glue.
- Most caterpillars are plant eaters (herbivores).
- Fully grown caterpillars attach themselves to a suitable twig or leaf before shedding their outside layer of skin to reveal a hard skin underneath known as a chrysalis.
- Butterflies have 4 wings.
- There are between 15,000 & 20,000 different species of butterflies.



- Most butterflies feed on nectar from flowers and have taste receptors on their feet.
- Adult butterflies can live anywhere from a week to a year depending on the species.
