STREET LIGHTS:



If you happen to see a street light that is out or not functioning properly, please contact the Borough Office. We are not always around at night to see the problems first-

hand, so any help would be greatly appreciated.

TAX COLLECTOR:

Linda Shaub, the Dallastown Borough Tax Collector will be at the Borough Office on Thursday, April 14th from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm and Monday,



April 18th from noon to 2:00 pm. She will be located in the Council Room to the rear of the building. Please enter thru the double glass doors on the side of the building.

PET OWNERS: When walking your pets, please be responsible and clean up after them. Thank you!



RENTAL UNITS: All residential rental units must be registered and inspected by the Borough.

VEHICLES: All vehicles parked outside of an enclosed structure (garage) shall be current with both inspection & registration, shall not have flat tires or be dismantled and must be operable.

POOLS: All Pools (temporary or permanent) capable of holding 24 inches of water or more, must

meet the building code regulations of Dallastown Borough. Please fill out the building permit application prior to setting up your pool.

TREES & SHRUBS OVERHANGING THE STREETS & SIDEWALKS:

Trees that are overhanging streets & sidewalks should be trimmed up about 15 feet. Bushes & shrubs growing out into the streets & sidewalks should be trimmed away from the right-of-way.

GRASS GROWING IN THE CURBS & SIDEWALKS:



The sidewalks adjacent to your property are yours to maintain. Grass & weeds are to be removed from curbing & sidewalks, including where the curb joins the street,

and around utility poles & traffic signs.

Help Dallastown Borough keep its small-town charm by removing the weeds from your sidewalks. Kindly refrain from discharging grass clippings into the streets or on the sidewalks.

GRASS GROWING IN EXCESS OF 8 INCHES ON YOUR PROPERTY:

Grass & other vegetation shall be maintained to a height of no more than 8 inches on your property. Poison ivy and other nuisance "weeds" shall be removed as well.



If your property falls into a non-compliance state, a violation letter will be sent by certified mail to the owner or tenants who reside on the property. If the nuisances still exist, a non-traffic citation will be issued each day the property is in non-compliance.

YARD SALE PERMIT: A permit is required, per



Dallastown Borough Ordinance. You may stop into the Borough office at 175 E. Broad St. to purchase a permit, the cost is \$10.00.

Penn Waste would like to issue a reminder to residents in south central Pennsylvania that pool chemicals should NOT be disposed of in your curbside trash and recycling bins. Pool chemicals are considered hazardous waste and need to be disposed of properly.


The Solution

Here are several options for getting rid of pool chemicals:

- Take them to a facility that handles hazardous waste. Make sure you check with your local solid waste authority to see if they accept pool chemicals prior to arriving.
- York County Solid Waste Authority
- Check with the pool store you originally bought them from to see if they have a disposal method.
- Donate them to a community pool or your neighbors who have pools.
- Shock your pool by dumping the left over pool chemicals in before you close it for the season.

We appreciate your help in keeping our team members safe!

What happens when it rains?



This illustration can show why stormwater management is very beneficial to the Dallastown Borough, Pennsylvania and the environment as a whole.

If stormwater has become polluted; oil from your car, chemicals on the lawn, trash in the sewer inlets, washing vehicles on the street, etc., it will eventually make its way back into our drinking water!

We can help by:

- Installing a rain barrel on your property

As we approach the spring/summer season, keep in mind....how prepared are you? Do you have your "Go Bag" packed? If you need a copy of the list for your bag, they are available at the Borough office. Also, make sure all family members have an ICE (in case of emergency) contact in their mobile devices, and know your shelter location. It is very important to make sure all family members know how to dial 911 when there is a life threatening emergency. Checking on your neighbors is always a good idea too. And don't forget your furry family members.....they also need a "Go Bag" and shelter placement along with a contact list including the veterinarian.

Not only do we need to worry about the preparation of our residential community, but also our community businesses need to ask themselves......how prepared are we? What is your "Ready to Go Plan"? COOPERATION

Take note of unusual vehicles in your neighborhoods. Keep an eye on your neighbors' homes while they are away. Be willing to cooperate with the criminal justice system if you happen to become a witness or victim of a crime. Report issues or concerns to an officer. Sometimes the small details can be the missing piece of the puzzle that can break a case. Remember, you can remain anonymous while still providing vital information to the police.

CAMERA REGISTRY

Turn Your Camera into a Crime Fighting Tool. Help us in preventing and solving crime using your security camera. It is simple, if an incident occurs near your device, we can identify and quickly request footage that may assist in an investigation. It is free, it's safe, and secure- at no time will the police have access to your camera without your permission.





Local transit authority, rabbittransit, is actively hiring due to a shortage in driver applicants over the past several months. Despite these challenges, rabbittransit continues to provide essential transportation to thousands of York County residents for employment, medical care and food access. rabbittransit partners with rabbitcares, a charitable organization, to offer a veterans employment transportation program. This program provides an 11-day fixed route pass for military veterans attending job interviews in Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin and York Counties.

In addition, rabbittransit has served as a place of employment for veterans transitioning to the civilian workforce. Full-time and part-time driving positions are available, offering weekly pay with wage rates similar to E4 to E6 pay. Some driving positions require a CDL with passenger endorsement and air brake restriction lifted. Active-duty service members or veterans who have at least two years of experience operating a commercial motor vehicle as part of previous military job requirements may be eligible for a military CDL testing waiver. A CDL is not necessary for all driving positions that are open. However, if an applicant is interested in getting their CDL, rabbittransit sponsors CDL training programs for its employees.

11 WAYS TO CONSERVE WATER AT HOME

- **1. Run a full dishwasher instead of handwashing:** If you ditch handwashing and run full loads of dishes instead, you can save 7,000 gallons of water annually.
- **2.** Compost to reduce disposal use: Save water in both your kitchen and your lawn by composting kitchen scraps at home.
- **3. Steam rather than boil vegetables:** Steaming your vegetables <u>saves water</u> and makes your vegetables more nutrient-rich.
- **4. Soak rather than rinse your pots and pans:** For items too big or dirty to make it into the dishwasher, skip the rinse and soak them to remove food buildup and stains.
- **5.** Take quick showers rather than baths: Bad news for tub enthusiasts: a full bath uses up to <u>70 gallons</u> of water. On the other hand, short showers can cut up to 45 gallons of that waste.
- **6. Turn off the faucet as you brush:** While brushing your teeth twice a day is important turning the faucet off during your teeth cleaning can save 10 gallons of water per day.
- **7. Install a high-efficiency toilet:** Older toilets use anywhere from 3.5 to 7 gallons of water per flush. If you're flushing 10 times a day, that's up to 70 gallons

- of water per day from your toilet alone. Installing a high-efficiency toilet cuts this water use down to 1.28 gallons or less per flush.
- 8. Check pipes and appliances for leaks regularly:
 Don't waste 105 gallons of water on leaky bathroom appliances. These appliances or pipes leaks are a major waste of water, and the worst part is that you're not aware you're using it.
- 9. Use cold water for your washes: Ninety percent of energy during the laundry process is used <u>heating the water</u>. Opting for cold water whenever possible, will save on energy costs. Turning down your hot water tank is another good way to conserve energy: Try setting it to 120 degrees or lower.
- **10. Run full loads:** Resist the urge to run a laundry load when you have a few dirty items. Running full loads instead of half loads can save 3,400 gallons of water annually.
- **11. Upgrade your appliances:** A household saves \$380 per year by upgrading to Energy Star and/or Water Sense appliances. Take the laundry room, for example. Energy-efficient washers can save up to 7,000 gallons of water per year. High-efficiency water heaters use up to 50 percent less energy.



• Step 1


